Course Description:

The course will cover blueprint reading as a foundation skill in construction for all trades in the industry. Whether in the field or in the office; knowing how to read blueprints is essential. Blueprints and plans vary from design professional and project. Understanding the fundamentals will assist you in progressing in your field of expertise.

Learning Objectives:

1. Basic knowledge and foundation of blueprint reading as it relates to building construction projects
2. Understand the general terms typically used in the design process by the design professionals and the construction industry
3. Be able to find specific trade information using blueprints
4. Be able to find the correlation between the blueprints/plans and the specifications
5. Be able to answer basic construction questions related to the layout and installation of materials at the jobsite
6. Be able to trouble shoot short comings of the blueprints you are using and what to do next.

Course Methodology and Requirements:

Course will be taught by lecture and participant interaction with classroom hands on use of plans using drawings both full scale and reduced size. A quiz will be given at the end of the course covering the information covered on four modules of Basic Blue Print Reading. Students will need an architect's scale and a tape measure.
