Dean Henninger – Celebration of Life Graveside Services October, 30, 2020 at 2:00 p.m. at Elmwood Memorial Park, Abilene, Texas.

With fond remembrances of Dean Henninger, one of West Texas AGC's leaders, we offer condolences to family and friends...

Abilene - Marvin "Dean" Henninger passed from this life in the early morning hours of October 25, 2020 at the age of 92. Dean was born September 28, 1928 to Fred and Ida Mae Henninger in Austin, Texas.

Dean came to Abilene to play football at Hardin Simmons and was an outstanding athlete. It was at Hardin-Simmons where Dean met the love of his life and wife of over 62 years, Juanita "Sue" Rose. Dean and Sue were married in May 1951 at the First Baptist Church of Abilene and soon welcomed three beautiful daughters-Roseann, Deanise, and Cynthia. The young Henninger family settled in Abilene where Dean joined Sue's father and brothers in the family construction business. Together, they would build the early

landscape of Abilene and surrounding communities. ***Dean's career in the construction industry would span five decades, including a tenure as President of the West Texas Chapter of The Associated General Contractors in 1995.*** Throughout his career, Dean's priority remained the health and well-being of his employees; some of whom would work alongside him until his retirement in the early 2000s and whom he would always consider family. AGC of America's October coronavirus survey and September construction employment by metro--US & TX results

AGC of America's October 7-19 coronavirus survey drew 1077 responses, including 88 from firms that identified TX as their principal state of operations. Our release, with links to the survey and September metro employment data, is [here](#). Full survey results for TX are [here](#). Here are selected results (all percentages are % of respondents):

- Are you currently experiencing any project delays or disruptions due to the following (mark all that apply):
Yes. US 78%, TX 73%
Leading reasons: Shortage of construction materials, equipment or parts: US 42%, TX 34%
Shortage of craftworkers/subcontractors: US 35%, TX 33%
- Did an owner postpone or cancel work on any upcoming projects in October 2020 or later? US 41%, TX 36%
- When do you expect your firm's volume of business will return to its normal level relative to one year earlier?
Volume already matches or exceeds year-ago level. US 35%, TX 35%
More than 6 months (or never). US 34%, TX 34%
- How do you expect your firm's headcount to change in the next 12 months?
Increase. US 37%, TX 40%
Decrease. US 20%, TX 15%

AGC released rankings of 358 metro areas by change in construction employment from September 2019 to September 2020. Construction employment declined in 234 areas (65%), increased in 86 (24%), and was unchanged in 38.

BLS posts construction-only data for Houston-The Woodlands-Sugar Land and San Antonio-New Braunfels, and combined employment data for 24 other areas in Texas. Statewide construction employment declined by 5% from September 2019 to September 2020, while combined employment declined by 9%. The Houston area had the nation's largest construction employment decrease (24,400 construction jobs, -10%). Midland had the 5th-largest numerical decrease and 7th-largest percentage decrease (-10,500 combined jobs, -27%), though many of the lost jobs were undoubtedly in mining (oil and gas drilling).

The Dallas-Plano-Irving area had the largest increase (5,100 combined jobs, 3%). San Antonio-New Braunfels had the 6th-largest numerical increase (1,800 construction jobs, 3%).

September's Architecture Billings Index registered at 47, although the project inquiries index increased to 57.2, indicating demand for new work, according to the American Institute of Architects. Demand for multifamily residential projects increased to 54, while demand for mixed-use and institutional projects registered at 47.3 and 40.5, respectively.
