

West Texas AGC Scholarship Committee Guidelines and Parameters

Applicants shall submit a complete application. Excerpts from application provided below:

- 1. Applicant shall have graduated from high school, be a current college undergraduate, or be working in the West Texas Chapter territory. Scholarships are for individuals pursuing two-year or four-year degree plans or an approved technical trades school in a construction related field.
- 2. Applicant shall be a U. S. citizen or be a documented permanent resident of the United States.
- 3. Preference shall be given to a relative or member of the West Texas AGC Chapter or an employee of a member; and further, that such Member shall have been an active member of the Chapter for two years prior to the application.
- 4. Applicant is responsible for ensuring the following items are submitted as one package and postmarked by Due Date.
- 5. Completed Application
 - a. Financial assistance needs are considered
 - b. Applicant should possess qualities of good character and integrity
- 6. Submit copy of ACT or SAT Scores
- 7. An up-to-date copy of your high school or college transcript of academic record
- 8. Two letters of support completed by teachers or faculty members
- 9. Essay stating why the applicant is pursuing a construction education and/or career (two pages maximum).

Parameters for Scholarship Review Committee

Scholarships should be a minimum of \$1,000.00 to a maximum of \$2,500.00 to individual applicants with a maximum of \$15,000.00 per year dispersed to all applicants. The Executive Committee will review parameters and increase or decrease these values based on the income of the annual Golf Tournament and the Chapter Scholarship Fund as needed. Awards are given annually to students from the West Texas AGC chapter area who are pursuing a career in construction through a Technical Trade School or Degree in the Construction / A & E Degree paths. If there are qualified applicants from outside the West Texas AGC chapter area, the committee may at their discretion consider awards, based on financial need and quality of applicants who meet the requirement of pursuing a career in construction through a Technical Trade School or Degree in the Construction / A & E Degree paths.
